Mr. Robertson,

With so many of us inundated daily with information and economic nightmares, it is unbelievable how difficult it is to get accurate information out of the Motor Vehicle Commission about the proposed *fee increases* and motorcycle service *decreases* that New Jersey's motorcyclists may be subject to. The Commission's attempt to *improve* its services has now come at an exorbitant cost for the state's motorcycling community and this community is very, very angry.

Angry to learn haphazardly that the state had decided to discontinue its highly successful Motorcycle Safety Education Courses at Sea Girt and Egg Harbor while still collecting the fee tacked onto each motorcycle endorsement (license) for the purpose of having a fund dedicated to motorcycle safety, awareness and education and still collect grant money from the Federal 2010 Fund which is to be dedicated *only* for use in furthering motorcycle safety and education in New Jersey.

Angry that Governor Corzine, while shouting that education is key to New Jersey's future, allows his Treasurer and the Commission to steal this money out of the Motorcycle *Education* Fund.

Worst of all, motorcyclists are angry that the Commission now publishes a proposal, which increases the cost of registering a motorcycle a minimum of 650%! In addition, to pour gasoline on an already contentious wound, it will not clarify whether or not motorcycle inspections will also be privatized, thus costing motorcyclists even more money. This is simply outrageous.

This injustice toward New Jersey motorcyclists *must* be acknowledged and corrected.

I would also at this time formally request an extension of the time for submission of public comments to Proposal Number PRN 2009-56.
